Part 8: Striving for the Top: Milk to Meat to Bone (2 Timothy 2:15)

“Work hard so you can present yourself to God and receive His approval. Be a good worker, one who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly explains the word of truth.”

Part 9: Defend the Course

Protect, justify, and maintain the specific intended direction despite facing criticism, opposition or setbacks.

This requires Strategic Action: maintaining a previously decided position even in the face of pressure to change it.

Text: Matthew 12:31-32 (a previously decided position):

“every kind of sin and slander can be forgiven, except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit, which will not be forgiven in this age or the age to come.”

This is a course that needs to be defended.

How are you defending the Course?

Paul called Timothy (2 Timothy 4:2) to defend the course:

² Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction.”



Part 9: Defend the Course

In **1 Peter 3:15**, Jesus said

“always be ready to give a defense of the faith that is in you, with gentleness and respect.”

“Defending God’s word” means:

→ **knowing it**

... so you defend with understanding, not just reaction

→ **living it**

... Matthew 5:16 emphasize “letting your life reflect God’s truth so others can see it.”

→ **explaining it consistently**

... “preach the word... in season and out of season,” meaning consistency even when it’s unpopular.

→ **doing all of that with the right spirit**

... The tone matters as much as the truth. It’s not about winning arguments.

How Did Jesus Defend the Course?

Jesus gained legitimacy by bringing “Striving for the Top” and “Defending the Course” to the forefront at all times - remained faithful to his mission despite pressure, opposition and suffering.

Jesus Strived for the Top:

“My food is to do the will of Him who sent me and to finish His work.” (John 3:34)

Jesus Defended the course: Example, "Zeal for your house will consume me" Psm 69:9, Jn 2:17

In John 2:13-17 ¹³“ ... Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴ In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. ¹⁵ So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. ¹⁶ To those who sold doves he said, “Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father’s house into a market!”

¹⁷ His disciples remembered that it is written: “Zeal for your house will consume me.”

Our Text: Matthew 12:31-32 (a previously decided position):

1. knowing it.
2. living it.

4. doing all of that with the right spirit - with gentleness and respect

Defending God’s course is important

In Galatians 2:7-8, Paul said he will focus on the gentile, while Peter is focused on the Jews:

⁷ they recognized that I had been entrusted with the task of preaching the gospel to the uncircumcised (gentiles), just as Peter had been to the circumcised (Jews). ⁸ For God, who was at work in Peter as an apostle to the circumcised, was also at work in me as an apostle to the Gentiles.

Paul defended God’s course for the gentiles.

So, Brethren, let us defend the course.
