
ON EAGLES' WINGS Exodus 19:4

FEAR NOT.

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2024 Important Broad Promises Revealed



Spirit, in us, and obey His command.

Exodus 19:4, God recounts how He has carried Israel on eagles' wings:

⁴ 'You yourselves have seen what I did to Egypt, and how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself'.

VS 5-6

" ⁵ Now if you obey me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all nations you will be my treasured possession. Although the whole earth is mine, ⁶ you will be for Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation."

What did God do for the Israelites?

First: the promise: Exodus 3: 7-8 (AMP and NIV)

⁷ The LORD said to Moses, "I have in fact <u>seen</u> the affliction (suffering, desolation) of My people who are in Egypt, and have <u>heard</u> their cry because of their taskmasters (oppressors); for I <u>know</u> their pain and suffering." "⁸ So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites".

Exodus 6: 4 "⁴I also established covenant with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob to give them the land of Canaan, where they resided as foreigners."

Second: the actions for fulfilment of promise (journeying to Canaan) – carrying them on eagles' wings:

- The exodus out of Egypt after 430years in slavery/bondage: Exodus 12:31-50... they left with silver/gold
- God brought Israelites out of Egypt with a mighty hand (Daniel 9:15)
- Crossing the red sea & killing the Egyptians without Israel's efforts Exodus 14:1-31
- Leading Israel through the wilderness: Exodus 15:22 Ex 18 (bitter water became sweet, manna & quail from heaven, water from the rock, etc.)

Third: the request to stay SANCTIFIED/OBEDIENT in order to become God's special ones : Exodus 19:5-6 "⁵ Now if you obey me **fully** and keep my covenant, **then out of all nations** you will be my treasured possession. Although the whole earth is mine, ⁶ you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.'

Brethren, it is so easy to see a monster in a room where there is no monster.

What do you see when you take a view into the land that God has assigned to you to occupy?

In numbers 13, Moses sent out 12 <u>Leaders</u> of the 12 tribes of Israel to go and explore (take a view into) the land of Canaan that God has assigned to them to occupy.

When they got there, 10 of them saw monsters and brough back negative report, only one (Caleb) saw victory and possibilities and brought back positive report, he was later supported by Hoshea whom Moses changed his name to Joshua).

¹"The LORD said to Moses, ² "Send some men to explore the land of Canaan, which I am giving to the Israelites. From each ancestral tribe send one of its leaders."...

"²⁶ They came back to Moses and Aaron and the whole Israelite community…
²⁷ They gave Moses this account: "We went into the land to which you sent us, and

it does flow with milk and honey! Here is its fruit. ²⁸ <u>But</u> the people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large. We even saw descendants of Anak there. ²⁹ The Amalekites live in the Negev; the Hittites, Jebusites and Amorites live in the hill country; and the Canaanites live near the sea and along the Jordan."

³⁰ Then Caleb silenced the people before Moses and said, "We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it."

³¹ But the men who had gone up with him said, "We can't attack those people; they are stronger than we are." ³² And they spread among the Israelites a bad report about the land they had explored. They said, "The land we explored devours those living in it. All the people we saw there are of great size. ³³We seemed like grasshoppers in our own eyes, and we looked the same to them."

Brethren, what we see is important. All the people who saw monsters and brought bad report did not make it to the land of Canaan because one cannot possess what one does not first see. **In Genesis 13:15,** God said to Abraham "All the land that you see I will give to you and your offspring forever."

Brethren, What Do You See when you explore your land?

What we must remember is that there are two distinct kingdoms:

- a. kingdom of the world where people do things by their own strength
- b. Kingdom of God where people do things by the power of the Almighty God. As Christians we live in the Kingdom of God and in this kingdom, the weapon of our warfare are not canal (not our strength) they are mighty through God.

Fortunately, besides Caleb and Joshua, we have leading examples of people who provide good signpost :

- Joshua did not use his power: by matching round the walls of Jericho, the walls fell.
- David did not use his power. He used the power of the Almighty God. When Goliath confronted the Israelites, their king (Saul) and the army of Israel saw powerful giant in Goliath and were afraid – seeing themselves as grasshoppers. But when David came, he saw the Goliath as uncircumcised Philistine defiling the army of the living God.

1 Samual 17

"³² David said to Saul, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him." ... ³⁷ The LORD who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine."

⁴⁵ David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. ⁴⁶ This day the LORD will deliver you into my hands, and I'll strike you down and cut off your head. ⁴⁷ All those gathered here will know that it is not by sword or spear that the LORD saves; for the battle is the LORD's, and he will give all of you into our hands."... ⁴⁹ Reaching into his bag and taking out a stone, he slung it and struck the Philistine on the forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell facedown on the ground.

• Gideon did not use his power

Judges 7 "¹² The Midianites, the Amalekites and all the other eastern peoples had settled in the valley, thick as locusts. Their camels could no more be counted than the sand

on the seashore.

¹⁶ Dividing the three hundred men into three companies, Gideon placed trumpets and empty jars in the hands of all of them, with torches inside.... ²⁰ The three companies blew the trumpets and smashed the jars. Grasping the torches in their left hands and holding in their right hands the trumpets they were to blow, they shouted, "A sword for the LORD and for Gideon!" ²¹ While each man held his position around the camp, all the Midianites ran, crying out as they fled.

Moses did not use his power: Only the stick in his hand patted the red sea

All the above examples understand that the one on Eagles Wings does not use his/her strength to soar (Exodus 19:4) - They all used the power of the Almighty God. God said, "You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself."

Brethren, let's fear not. For God will carry us on eagles' wings as He is taking us to where He has promised us. GOD BLESS YOU!
