# WALKING AMONG THE STONES OF FIRE

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## Ezekiel 28:13-14

<sup>13</sup>“You were in Eden, the garden of God. Your clothing was adorned with every precious stone — all beautifully crafted for you and set in the finest gold. They were given to you on the day you were created. <sup>14</sup>I ordained and anointed you as the mighty angelic guardian. You had access to the holy mountain of God and walked among the stones of fire.”

Walking among the stones of fire (walking in Christ’s triumphal procession) keeps our intimate relationship with God and gives us access to His glory. We become guiding light to others, as shown through our words, action and behaviour.

**2 Corinthians 2:14-15** “<sup>14</sup> Thanks be to God, who always leads us as captives in Christ’s triumphal procession and uses us to spread the aroma of the knowledge of Him everywhere. <sup>15</sup> For we are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing.”

## Discernment defined:

It is a spiritual gift and a necessary skill for believers, reflected in the influence of the Holy Spirit in our situational interpretations and actions and enabling our ability to distinguish between truth & false, and good & evil.

## Hebrews 5: 13 & 14

<sup>13</sup>For everyone who lives on milk is still an infant, inexperienced in the message of righteousness. <sup>14</sup>But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil. .... **ESV**

But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, *that is*, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil. .... **NKJV**

**In Philippians 1:9, Paul encouraged us sayig..**

“<sup>9</sup> And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, <sup>10</sup> so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ.”

**Brethren** discernment equips us with power to approve what is excellent. And this power not only enables us to succeed daily as Christians at work but also preserves us for the day Jesus comes.

**Jesus' discernment ability was crucial to His success in ministry.**

### **1. Understanding People's Motives**

**He know what people were thinking**

**Matthew 9:4** “Knowing their thoughts, Jesus said, “Why do you entertain evil thoughts in your hearts?”

**John 13:27** “So Jesus told him, “What you are about to do, do quickly.”

### **2. He know how to Avoid Deception/schemes**

**Colossians 2:4** “<sup>4</sup>I tell you this so that no one may deceive you by fine-sounding arguments.”

**Luke 23:3** “So Pilate asked Jesus, “Are you the king of the Jews?” “You have said so,” Jesus replied.”

### **3. Making the right choices**

How did He choose the disciple who stayed on with Him and even included the one who would betray Him, as he needs to be close to him to do that.

Jesus chose them not based on popular opinion, but with divine insight into their potential.

**Galatians 1:18–19** : “**18** Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and remained with him fifteen days. **19** But I saw none of the other apostles except James the Lord’s brother.”

### **4. Effective Teaching and Ministry:**

**John 4:** <sup>16</sup> He told her, “Go, call your husband and come back.” <sup>17</sup> “I have no husband,” she replied.

Jesus said to her, “You are right when you say you have no husband. <sup>18</sup> The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true.”

<sup>19</sup> “Sir,” the woman said, “I can see that you are a prophet.... <sup>28</sup> Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town and said to the people,.... <sup>30</sup> They came out of the town and made their way toward him.

### **5. Navigating Opposition: Example Luke 20**

the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and elders, <sup>2</sup> “Tell us by what authority you are doing these things,” they said. “Who gave you this authority?” <sup>3</sup> He replied, “I will also ask you a question. Tell me: <sup>4</sup> John’s baptism—was it from heaven, or of human origin?”
