Ezekiel 28:13-14

¹³“You were in Eden, the garden of God. Your clothing was adorned with every precious stone — all beautifully crafted for you and set in the finest gold. They were given to you on the day you were created. ¹⁴I ordained and anointed you as the mighty angelic guardian. You had access to the holy mountain of God and walked among the stones of fire.”

Walking among the stones of fire (walking in Christ’s triumphal procession) keeps our intimate relationship with God and gives us access to His glory. We become guiding light to others, as shown through our words, action and behaviour.

2 Corinthians 2:14-15 “¹⁴ Thanks be to God, who always leads us as captives in Christ’s triumphal procession and uses us to spread the aroma of the knowledge of Him everywhere. ¹⁵ For we are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing.”

Series Part 21: Devine Encounter

As we journey in Christ's triumphal procession, we should be open-minded and, on the look out for encounter experiences that are divine in nature, which would impact our appreciation of God and how He works.

These encounters could come in the form of miracles, affirmations of God's word, life transformations. A good example is the transformation of the disciples after Jesus' resurrection. The disciples had always followed Jesus, but certain things became clearer after Jesus' resurrection.

In this encounter, God may lead us to places or put you in situations He would require us to exercise our faith, or get better understanding of, or revelation about, specific part(s) of God's word or turn an adamant unsaved person (who is firm and unyielding in their refusal to believe in Jesus Christ) to saved or pray down God's miracles to solve a problem.

Walking among the stones of fire. In Jesus triumphal procession, we need to be expectant of God's Devine encounter. This encounter happens without a plan and totally unexpected.

Series Part 21: Devine Encounter

Examples of Devine encounters:

John 20: 11-16: Mary Magdalene's encounter

¹¹ Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. ¹³ They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." ¹⁴ At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ He asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary."

Notice, that Mary Magdalene was very diligent about Christ and very committed. These are qualities we need to get an encounter.

John 20:1-2 "Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!." **Mary Magdalene was always in the present about Jesus.**

Series Part 21: Devine Encounter

John 20:19-23, , the disciples' encounter

First encounter: ¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰ After he said this, He showed them His hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Luke 24:45-49

Second encounter: ⁴⁵ Then He opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Series Part 21: Devine Encounter

John 21:3-11 , Peter's Encounter (Part1)

³ “I’m going out to fish,” Simon Peter told the other disciples with him, and they said, “We’ll go with you.” So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. ⁴ Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus.

⁵ **He called out to them, “Friends, haven’t you any fish?” “No,” they answered.**

⁶ He said, “Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some.” When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish.

⁷ Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, “It is the Lord!” As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, “It is the Lord,” he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. ⁸ The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish. ... ¹¹ So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn.”

Series Part 21: Devine Encounter

Peter's Encounter (Part 2)

John 21:15-17 “¹⁵ When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?” “Yes, Lord,” he said, “you know that I love you.” Jesus said, “Feed my lambs.” ¹⁶ Again Jesus said,“Take care of my sheep.” ¹⁷ The third time he said to him,“Feed my sheep.

Brethren, after this encounter, Peter was not the same. For instance, Peter was able to Heal a Lame Beggar.

Acts3: 3- “³ ...⁴ Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, “Look at us!”
⁶ “.....Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk.” ⁷ Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. ⁸ He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God.

Conclusion, brethren, we are in a perfect state for Devine encounter. Let's be expectant. Encounter satisfies our quest (Mary Magdaline), brings response to our questions, make way where there is no way (lots of fish and the net did not break), gives us inner power for God's work like Peter. Let's be ready and embrace God's encounter. ...**God Bless You**
